#### On the Street and On Facebook: The Homeless Stay Wired

Mr. Pitts Lacks a Mailing Address But He's Got a Computer and a Web Forum

SAN FRANCISCO -- Like most San Franciscans, Charles Pitts is wired. Mr. Pitts, who is 37 years old, has accounts on Facebook, MySpace and Twitter. He runs an Internet forum on Yahoo, reads news online and keeps in touch with friends via email. The tough part is managing this digital lifestyle from his residence under a highway bridge.

"You don't need a TV. You don't need a radio. You don't even need a newspaper," says Mr. Pitts, an aspiring poet in a purple cap and yellow fleece jacket, who says he has been homeless for two years. "But you need the Internet."

Mr. Pitts's experience shows how deeply computers and the Internet have permeated society. A few years ago, some people were worrying that a "digital divide" would separate technology haves and have-nots. The poorest lack the means to buy computers and Web access. Still, in America today, even people without street addresses feel compelled to have Internet addresses.

New York City has put 42 computers in five of the nine shelters it operates and plans to wire the other four this year. Roughly half of another 190 shelters in the city offer computer access. The executive director of a San Francisco nonprofit group, Central City Hospitality House, estimates that half the visitors to its new eight-computer drop-in center are homeless; demand for computer time is so great that users are limited to 30 minutes.

Shelter attendants say the number of laptop-toting overnight visitors, while small,

#### 'Kidnapped son' found on Facebook



Gavin Paros had not seen his mother Avril for 27 years

A mother has been reunited with her son, 27 years after she claims he was kidnapped, after her sister saw him on the social networking site Facebook.

Avril Grube, 62, who lives in Poole, Dorset, says she was given custody of her son Gavin Paros after her marriage to a Hungarian man broke down in 1982.

His father, who died in 2006, had visiting rights but took him to Hungary and Ms Grube has not seen him since.

But Mr Paros, 29, met his mother this week after being found on Facebook.

Ms Grube, who was only discharged from hospital a week ago, said: "I would love it so much to have Gavin back living in Britain."

She and her sister Beryl Wilson, 59, who lives in Liverpool, had spent years trying to trace their relative, even contacting the Hungarian Embassy and taking their case to former Prime Minister Margaret Thatcher.



Ms Wilson told BBC Radio Solent: "[Mr

Paros' father] had visitation rights, he said he was going to the zoo or somewhere and when he didn't arrive back we found out he had taken him back to Hungary.

#### Man given up for adoption as baby finds family on Facebook

A man who was given up for adoption as a newborn baby has found his long-lost family after 33 years through Facebook.

Richard Marks, 33, has been reunited with his birth mum Carol Horridge who gave him away at just three-days-old so he could have a better life.

He grew up with his adopted parents living just two miles from his biological family without realising and when he was 18 decided to search for his birth mum.

Mr Marks contacted Bury Social Services and discovered his sister Andrea Roczniak had dropped off two letters in the hope he would get in touch but had since moved away.

A subsequent 15 year search proved fruitless until he decided to try Facebook this month.

He sent messages to dozens of Roczniaks in the local area before Andrea replied saying "I think you're my brother."

"I couldn't believe it when I realised I had found them," he said,

"I called Andrea and she started telling me how she had been looking for me for 12 years and how I had a massive family waiting to meet me. After all

these years it felt completely natural to speak to her.

"After that I called my mum. I could hear a faint voice blubbering so I said 'hello mum' and that was it we were talking and crying for the next two and a half hours.

"Since then we have talked lots and I have been re-listening to a message over and over again just to hear her voice."

If you're going out of town, you're supposed to have someone come by to take in your mail and newspapers so as not to advertise the fact that your home is empty. Therefore, it should go without saying that putting a sign on your front door that says "temporarily unoccupied" would be about as dumb as it gets. So if you're careless about what you post online, you may be doing just that.

According to a Friday report by ABC News, East Mesa, Arizona's Israel Hyman recently discovered this the hard way when his home was robbed of thousands of dollars in computer equipment while he was out of town. When his father, Gerry, stopped by to check on the house, he found the back door jimmied open and his son's Mac Pro, a pair of 23-inch LCD screens, and other equipment missing. Israel believes that the thieves might have been tipped off by his <u>Twitter</u> messages, which also update his <u>Facebook</u> status.
